Childress, Neill named best

Randolph Childress, '95, and Stephanie Neill, '95, were recently named the university's athletes of the year for the 1994-95 season. Both athletes led their teams to ACC Championships as well as top-10 national rankings last year.

Childress, an All-American in basketball and Most Valuable Player at the ACC Tournament, received the "Arnold Palmer Award" as the leading male athlete. Neill, a three-time first team All-American in golf, won the "Marge Crisp Award" as the school's top female athlete.

Deacons 34th in Directors Cup

The Demon Deacon athletic program finished 34th in the final standings of the Sears Director's Cup. This award is given annually to the Division I school that has the most competitive overall program in the country.

Stanford finished No.1, followed by North Carolina, UCLA, Arizona and Florida. Southern California, Michigan, Penn State, Nebraska and Texas round out the top-10.

In the ACC, the Deacons finished behind North Carolina, Virginia (19th), Duke (21st), Florida State (24th) and N.C. State (32nd). All ACC schools made it in the top-100.

Last year the team finished 50th in the standings.

Schultz named Player of Week

Deacon freshman Jessica Schultz received Atlantic Coast Conference Player of the Week honors for the week of Sept. 4 after recording two game-winning goals in a two day stretch.

Saturday, Schultz provided the Deacons' winning margin in a 2-1 win over California. The freshman then netted an overtime goal a day later against top-ranked James Madison to give the Deacons a 3-2 road win.

The win over the Dukes was the Deacons' second win in school history over a ranked opponent, and their first ever on the road.

Men's soccer places second in adidas-WFU Classic

The formula for the men's soccer team in the adidas/Wake Forest Soccer Classic was unusual, to say the least.

Play sloppily, and earn a win; control the tempo, and lose a game.

The Deacons (1-1) earned second place in the Classic by defeating Charleston, a national quarterfinalist last season, 3-1 Saturday, then falling to Stanford 1-0 Monday in the championship match.

Against Stanford, the Deacons allowed a goal just 2:02 into the game. After that, the Deacons controlled the flow of the game, outshooting the Cardinal 8-3 in the first half and having seven corner kicks to Stanford's one.

But the Demon Deacons came up empty—barely—time after time. Sophomore Ihor Dotsenko missed on four quality opportunities, two on headers, and freshman Serge Daniv also had his chances, putting five shots on goal.

"The rhythm of our play was better today," Head Coach Jay Vidovich said after Monday's loss. "But the goals like Ihor's—those goals don't happen every day."

The Deacons were able to capitalize on their opportunities against Charleston, notching a 3-1 win. Daniv scored the first Deacon goal of the year in the 34th minute, putting in a crossing shot after stealing the ball from a Cougar defender.

In the second half, the Demon Deacons scored twice more to put the game out of reach. Dotsenko scored on a looping free kick from a sharp angle on the left side in the 58th minute.

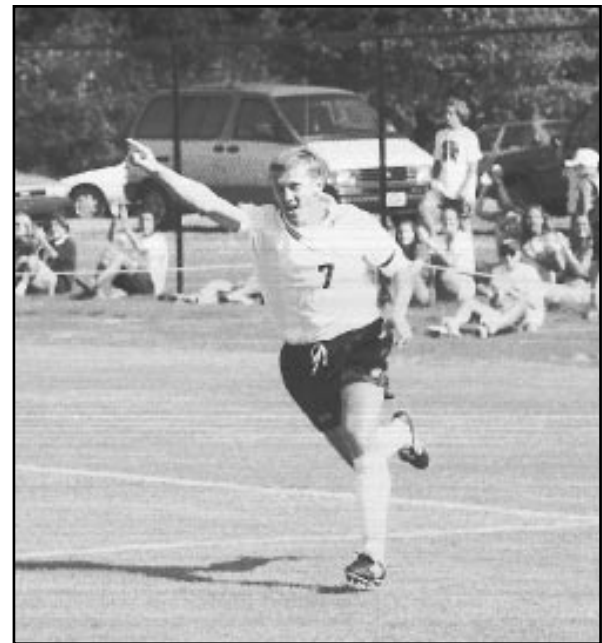
In the 72nd minute, senior Erik Brandsma was fouled inside the 18-foot box, leading to a penalty kick that junior Josh Timbers converted for the third Deacon goal.

Junior Deacon goalkeeper Sal Fontana played well in both games for the Deacons, notching four saves in each match. Fontana is returning to the Deacon goal after a redshirt season.

"He's coming back and getting rhythm," Vidovich said of Fontana. "But it will take him a while to get it completely back."

The Deacons will compete this weekend in the Panther Invitational in Madison, WI. The Deacons take on ninth-ranked Wisconsin Saturday, and Sunday face the University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee, which was an NCAA Tournament team last season.

The next home game for the Demon Deacons is Wednesday against Lenior-Rhyne.

Women's soccer loses at Duke, wins 6-0 at UNC-W

Emotions were high as the women's soccer team kicked off its season Saturday against ACC rival Duke.

The Deacons held their ground against the mighty Blue Devils, currently ranked fourth in the nation, and were narrowly beaten in the second half when Duke senior Kelly Walbert drove in the game-winning goal, securing Duke a 2-1 victory.

The Deacons started eight talented freshmen in the matchup, each of whom played her heart out against a Duke team that brought back nine starters from last year's ACC regular-season championship team.

The Blue Devils snagged the first goal

20 minutes into the contest when all-time scoring leader Kelly Walbert found an opening in the Deacon defense. Nevertheless, the Deacons refused to yield to the Blue Devil attack and after trailing 1-0 at halftime, returned to the field more determined than ever.

Eight minutes into the half, freshman sensation Rachel Thomas tied it up for the Deacons when she scored off an assist from fellow freshman Kim Reynolds.

Just two minutes later, Duke's Walbert managed to fire one past Deacon sophomore goalkeeper Jacki Ball, who had a total of 14 saves for the evening.

Determination simply was not enough for the Deacons as they suffered a heart-wrenching one goal defeat.

Head Coach Chris Turner was very sur-

prised with the effort his team displayed during the contest.

While he was quite pleased with how well his young team responded to the challenge, Turner was quick to point out that his team was not satisfied by any means.

Turner said that he feels strongly that the Deacons need to eliminate mistakes that result from inexperience on the college level and that he believes his team has substantial room for improvement.

Freshman striker Julie Scott appeared to be at the top of her game when the Demon Deacons breezed past UNC-Wilmington at Brook's Field Tuesday.

Scott racked up two goals and one assist during the first 15 minutes of the game and dished out an additional assist during the

second half action.

Freshmen Norine Fernbach, Meredith Lester, Lisa Olynk and sophomore Amanda Lewis also scored for the Deacons and paved the way to an easy 6-0 victory.

Although Turner was not nearly as pleased with his team's performance against UNC-Wilmington, he remains very optimistic about what the future holds for the Demon Deacons in the coming year.

With a little patience and a lot of hard work, the women's soccer team could very well prove a force to be reckoned with.

The Deacons will be back in action Saturday when they host UNC-Asheville at 4 p.m. on Polo Field.
