

Trio of Deacons travels to Athens for Southern Collegiate Championships

The Demon Deacon men's tennis squad competed in its first fall tournament of the 1995-96 campaign last weekend. The tournament, the Southern Collegiate Championships in Athens, Ga., is an annual gathering of top collegiate players from across the nation. Representing the Deacons this year were sophomores Daniel Merkert and Jimmy Chou and senior James Hosie.

Stuttgart, Germany, played his first match as a Demon Deacon. Showing a great amount of poise and maturity, Merkert demonstrated no signs of nervousness as he cruised to the fifth round of the event's A flight before falling to the top seed.

His first opponent, Ariel Gaitan of Kentucky, provided little challenge in surrender-

ing in straight sets, 6-3, 6-2. Merkert also defeated his second foe, Christian Lenze of Alabama-Birmingham, by the same tally.

Merkert's run eventually came to an end in the fifth round of the tournament. No. 1 seed Steven Baldas of Georgia provided more of a challenge than Merkert could handle.

Despite a hard fought first set which went to a tie-breaker, the 16th seed Merkert was unable to grasp victory once again in losing, 7-6(6), 6-3.

Hosie, also competing in the highly competitive A flight, turned in a respectable effort

as well. Against Cy Scammel of the Citadel, Hosie clawed for the early lead by taking the first set, 7-5. Spurred on by the strong first set effort, Hosie finished off his foe in straight sets with a convincing 6-3 second set victory.

The third round marked the end of the tournament for Hosie. Facing a strong opponent, John Roddick of

Georgia, Hosie managed to win only two games in a 6-1, 6-1 loss.

Chou, the sole Demon Deacon representative in the B flight, also made it to the third round of his bracket.

Chou defeated Eric Turnquist of Georgia Tech, 6-4, 6-3, before falling to Dito Panea of Jacksonville State in a tight match, 3-6, 6-4, 6-1.

The Demon Deacons men's tennis team will return to action this weekend when they travel to Chapel Hill to take part in the North Carolina Invitational.

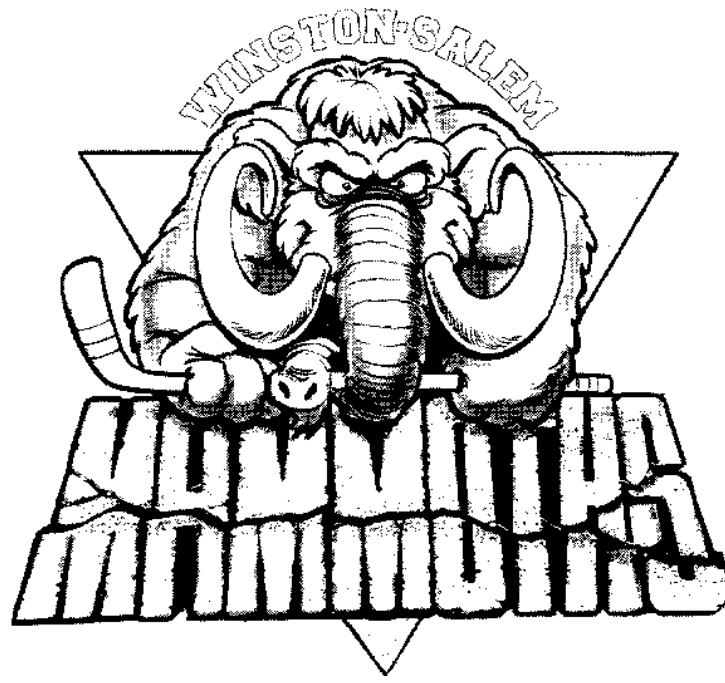
