## Faculty-Student Collaborative Project Grants Deadline: First Monday of Every Month

Grants of up to \$2,000 are available to support expenses with a collaborative project (supplies, minor equipment, travel expenses, not student stipends). Since there are potential programs to support faculty projects, the focus for this program is on student support. Students and faculty may also apply for travel grants to support their joint attendance at professional meetings. Previous students supported have collected data on nesting habitats of birds, synthesized polymers, investigated regionalism in Italian projects, surveyed a crypt in France, and presented papers at conferences. Interested students should pick up applications at the Provost's office after discussing potential projects with faculty mentors.

## Student Professional Meeting Travel Grant Deadline: First Monday of Every Month

There is a limited amount of money available to support student travel to attend professional meetings. These grants do not require the student to present a paper or poster at the meeting or to attend the meeting with a faculty member, as do COLLAB grants. Interested students should pick up applications at the Provost's Office.

## 1997 Student Summer Research and Creative Activities Grants Deadline: February 14, 1997

For summer of 1997. 15 grants, each with a stipend of \$2,000, will be available with an additional \$500 available for expenses associated with each project. Upon completion of the project, students may apply for up to \$700 to support student travel to attend a professional conference to present a paper or poster based upon the summer project. Working with their faculty mentors, previous students in the program have developed computer software for ultrasound imaging, examined dietary practices of adolescent females, researched water movement through cell membranes, trained with the American Dance Theater, researched and wrote an encyclopedia entry about a Russian economist, assembled as African-American art exhibit, and interviewed and wrote about Buddhist women. Interested student should pick up applications at the Provost's Office.
