"Greg was a calm, levelheaded person," according to Junior Brad Preslar, the president of Theta Chi. "He was a real leader."

Faculty members agreed about Wilson's merits. Kline Harrison, an associate professor of business and accountancy and the adviser for Theta Chi, said, "The (Theta Chi) brothers and I saw potential in him as a leader." Wilson was the president of his pledge class.

Pat Johansson, the associate dean of the college, taught Wilson in English 175 last semester. "He was always pleasant, always courteous," she said. "He was very bright but very quiet."

always wearing one," she said.

According to Chaplain Ed Christman, "(Wilson) was thought of as a leader, a person other people really liked."

Christman also said that in response to Wilson's death he had visited Wilson's fraternity brothers to console them and to talk with them about their loss of a good friend.

Wilson was the third student from the university to pass away this school year and the eighth in the past two years. Because of the loss of eight students in the last two years, the university has made efforts to help students cope with what they are feeling, according to Christman.

"We repond by trying to provide as much support as we can and hoping it won't keep happening," Christman said.

A memorial service for Wilson was held Jan. 10 in Fort Wayne, and a campus memorial service will be held at 11 a.m. Jan. 20 in Wait Chapel.

The memorial service will be a time for the community to heal as one, since Wilson's death was a loss for everyone, Christman said.

"A community is a group of people who rejoice when one person rejoices, we all can rejoice; therefore when one person suffers, we all suffer," he said. "If a person dies, we have all lost something."

Christman and other friends of Wilson are currently working to organize the service. Preslar said that the members of Theta Chi are preparing something for the service.

Christman said that he invites anyone interested in sharing in the service to participate. "Anyone who would like to participate in some way should be in touch with the chaplain immediately," he said.

their own for the recolonization.

"We will come back in with a chapter that will not tolerate hazing. We will start from scratch. The students that will begin in 2000 will be students who will be hand-selected," Wilson said.

However, none of the members of Kappa Sig that were found guilty of hazing will be allowed to participate in the recolonization, Wilson said. They are all being investigated by the national organization for individual violations.

"We have investigated and have placed charges against some members through our procedures," Wilson said.

The national fraternity of Kappa Sigma will expel, suspend or drop to alumni status members of the

Delta Omega chapter of the Kappa Sigma fraternity pending the outcome of an ongoing investigation.

The university will increase its pledge education efforts during this Rush period, Ford said.

"I think we will probably be more vigilant in terms of ensuring that the pledge educators are following their curriculum or pledge education," Ford said.

The office of Student Development will be holding pledge education sessions to ensure the fraternity brothers and the pledges are aware of the rules. "In light of the hazing situation from Kappa Sigma, we will be redoubling our efforts to educate both the incoming new members as well as the pledge education about what constitutes hazing and about what risk is involved there. In that sense I think it will be a much more positive pledge education experience for those who are in the process," Ford said.

office of the provost are carried out smoothly. We will continue to meet on a regular basis indefinitely," Gladding said.

As senior vice president, Wilson plans to focus on academic programs, faculty issues, the curriculum and the relationship of students to the aforementioned things.

"I will be exceedingly interested in curriculum review. I will be active in decisions about new faculty appointments," Wilson said. "I am interested in the question of whether we can use the new technology in such a way as to expand rather than change the liberal arts education."

An alumnus of the university, Wilson joined the faculty of the English department in 1951. He was the dean of the college from 1957-1958 and a dean from 1958-1967. In 1990, Wilson was appointed vice president for special projects, and he has focused on teaching since 1994.

Gladding joined the university in 1990 as a professor of counseling and an assistant to the president for special projects. Gladding directs the counselor education program and chairs the Fund for Ethics and Leadership and the mini-grant committee for the university's Year of Religion in American Life. He has also served as a temporary chairman of the department of religion and as a faculty sponsor of the City of Joy scholars.
