

Club sports have enjoyed a semester full of activities

The fall semester has been a busy one for students playing club sports and those that have participated in the many other student-run athletic groups on campus. Here is a run down of what some organizations have been up to since August and what they have in store for their members when they return from the winter break.

Field Hockey

The field hockey club team has played four games, winning one. It would have like to have played more games, but it is looking forward to next semester and is pleased with what it has accomplished this semester.

Ice Hockey

The ice hockey club team has joined the ACC Hockey League and played games against Radford and Appalachian State. It won both games, and attracted about 150 people for its victory over Appalachian State. Problems with funding has made setting up games difficult.

Women's Lacrosse

The women's lacrosse club team had a successful season, going 4-1-1 in non-tournament play. It had tournaments at Davidson and in Atlanta. It played three varsity teams in the Davidson tournament, which was early in the season. At the Atlanta tournament, it played four club teams - the Atlanta Women's Club team, Georgia, South Carolina and Emory.

Men's Lacrosse

The men's lacrosse club team played three games this semester and had a lot of participants. It beat N.C. State at home and then lost in overtime to Elon and

UNC. The team had no subs to use against UNC.

Women's Tennis

The women's tennis club has had one match so far. It played Virginia at UNC and lost by a close margin. The team had two other matches that were canceled this semester. About 20 freshmen joined the club this year.

The team has also started and joined the Atlantic Collegiate Club Tennis League, which is expected to help with scheduling matches.

Men's Tennis

The men's tennis club team has also joined the Atlantic Collegiate Club Tennis League. It has not had a match yet but practices about two times a week. The team of 10 players.

Women's Volleyball

The women's volleyball club played in a tournament in October at Appalachian State and hosted a game against UNC-Greensboro. It played numerous pick-up games with the men's team.

Baseball

The baseball club team had its first fall season this semester, playing five games. Among the teams they played were Virginia, N.C. State and the Greensboro College varsity team.

The women's soccer club team has played eight games this semester, going 3-4-1. They traveled to Richmond to

play Richmond and James Madison University. They also played Richmond again, Davidson two times, UNC, UNC-Greensboro and had a big victory over Appalachian State.

"We've had a strong showing from the freshmen," sophomore co-captain Nicole Balliet said. "We've gotten lots of participation. All our losses have been really close."

Rugby

The rugby-football club team finished with a record of 3-2. It was the team's first winning season recently.

Senior Bryan Beach, who scored 66 of his team's 86 points this season, made the All-South rugby team after playing for the North Carolina Select Team. He is now part of an All-American pool that consists of 320 players from eight regional teams.

Running

The running club team had a race planned during parents' weekend but it didn't work out so the team had no races this semester. They spent most of the semester trying to raise money and practicing (about four times a week). The club is composed mainly of freshmen.

Fencing

The fencing club team, which is new this year, has got off to a good start.

The club consists of 13 official members, who have paid their dues and gone to practices. Two members recently went to a tournament in Charlotte and did fairly well. It has been difficult to get the whole team to go to a tournament because of budget problems and the club doesn't have any of its own equipment.

Wrestling

The wrestling club team has not had any competitions this semester but has been holding practice 3 to 5 times a week

for those who want it.

The club is getting more active than it has been for the past two years and is looking forward to competitions in the second semester. Money from the university was used to buy a new wrestling mat.

Equestrian

The equestrian club team has gone strong with approximately 30 members this year. Many of their riders have competed successfully on Class A, Regional and National circuits this year, and ride several disciplines including hunter-jumper, saddle-seat, dressage and western.

Ultimate Frisbee

The ultimate frisbee club team, in its first year of existence, was chartered this year and given a budget for next year. Although their season doesn't officially start until the spring, the club will be playing in its fourth unofficial club tournament this weekend. Next semester, it will compete in 7 to 10 tournaments.

Cycling

The cycling club team has had no races this semester, but it has new jerseys printed and hopes to have one or two races next semester.

"We've got a lot of freshmen," sophomore club president Sam Barger said. "We're trying to get as many kids as possible to try out."

Karate

The karate club has had two belt tests and just competed in The Superstars Karate Tournament in Virginia Nov. 13. A group of six was taken to the tournament to compete.

At the advanced level, junior Trevor Spinelli took third place in open form and fourth place in musical form, and instructor Rick McFarland took first in

traditional form and third in musical form.

At the intermediate level, freshman Sarah Mastalir took first in form and second in fighting. At the beginning level, freshman Jesse Kahle took first in form and fighting, freshman Scott Newbern took second in form and fighting and sophomore

Shelly Adams took second in traditional form and third in open form. Freshman Anne Argenta took second in open form, third in traditional form and fourth in fighting.

Crew

The crew club team has had no meets yet but has practiced a lot. A new rowing shell was bought in August, and the members has learned how to row so the club expects to be ready for second semester.

Practice is stopped now, but over first semester, practice in some capacity was held six times a week and members went to about three practices a week.

Golf

The golf club team was chartered this semester. It spent much of the semester getting its budget set up and getting organized for the spring. The team hopes to have matches next semester against teams such as Duke and N.C. State.




