Basmati: A taste of India

absolutely outstanding.

Palak paneer, or spinach with cottage cheese, is perennial veggie favorite.

The waiters also are conscientious in refilling water glasses for overworked western palates unaccustomed to the robust flavors of south Asian spices.

Basmati offers five different *biryanis*.

These are complex dishes of rice, meat and vegetables from southern India.

I didn't get to try this "pride of Basmati," but the chicken, lamb, shrimp and vegetable varieties sound enticing.

Be sure to order north Indian *roti* or *paratha*, unleavened breads either baked or fried on a griddle.

Plain or flavored *naan* is especially delicious and essential for

My personal favorites are the colorful, slow-cooked southern Indian dishes. Usually steamed or roasted, these dishes of meats

and vegetables in aromatic sauces are always accompanied by the nutty, delicate Basmati rice that lends the establishment its name.

mopping up the last of a curry sauce or spinach dish.

The waiter will also be happy to recommend a wine to complement your meal; I had a delicious Shiraz.

If your taste runs to the sweet, a traditional milky, fruity *lassi* might hit the spot.

The prices for entrees, appetizers and desserts are more than

reasonable for the top-notch food; appetizers are \$4 to \$11, desserts around \$3.

Basmati also offers a weekday buffet for \$6.99 and buffets on the weekends for \$9.99.

Although it might take a moment to flag down a waiter for the bill, you're going to need the extra time to digest the appetizers, entrees and bread you'll have devoured.

Sit back and enjoy the seemingly authentic Indian decor, including paintings, or the soothing salmon-colored walls.

Or visit the bar to the right behind a beaded curtain.

Basmati is a welcome addition to local ethnic cuisine, worthy of both a first-time and repeat visits.
