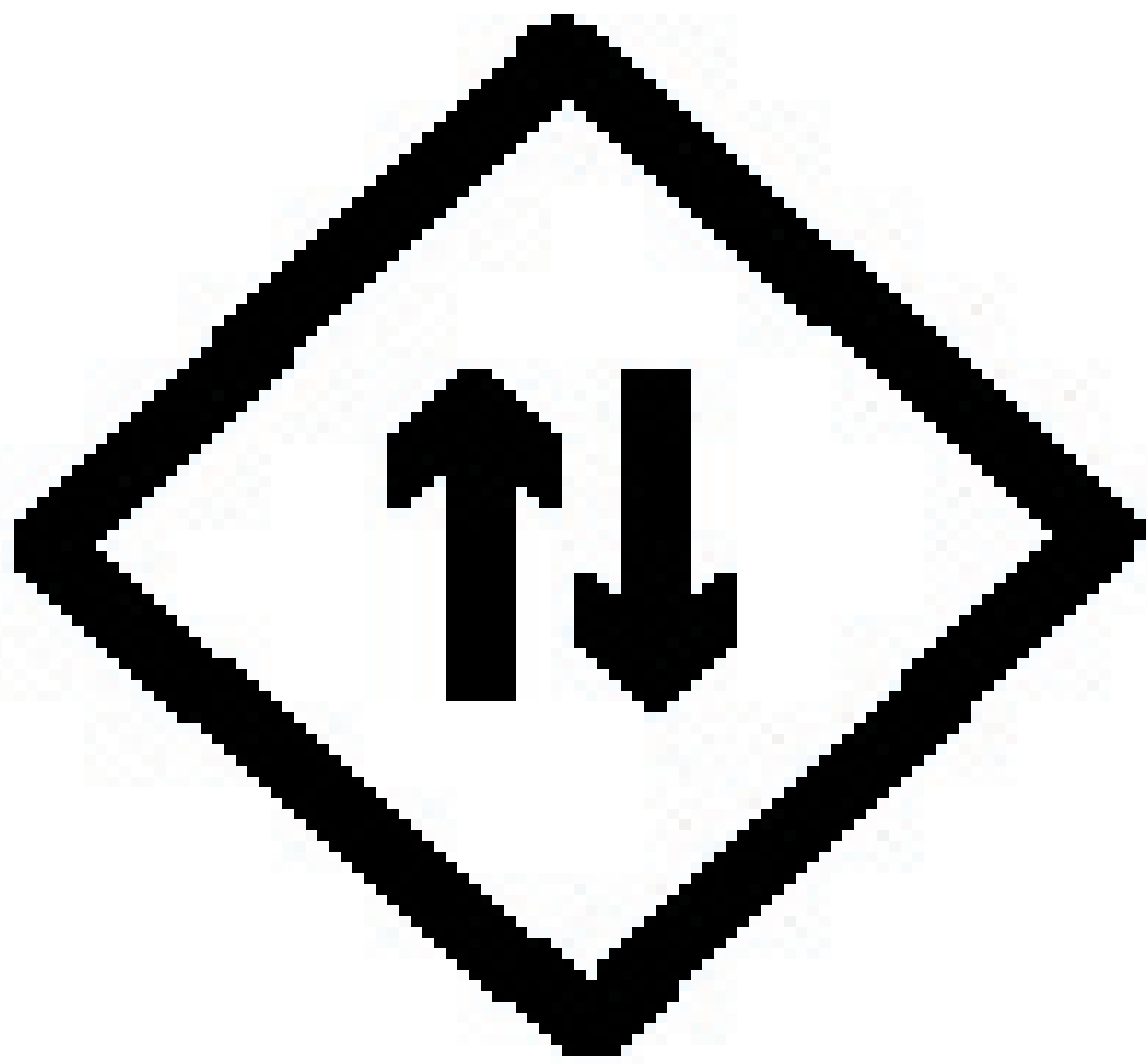
Though Brother Beck of PIKA was injured in the tussle, students have continued to flock to the well-known establishment and should probably consider
