

# Symposia: Two discussions sub for Convocation

Calloway School of Business and Accountancy and the Graduate School of Arts and Sciences. The Babcock Graduate School of Management has cancelled classes for full-time students beginning at 1 p.m., and the Divinity School has cancelled classes beginning at 1:30 p.m. The School of Law will operate on its normal schedule.

The two symposia will take place Oct. 19 in Brendle Recital Hall. The first, entitled, "Why the Liberal Arts? Exploring the Aims of a University Education," is designed to delve into what experiences are pertinent in a modern liberal arts education for a successful future. It will be moderated by Stanley N. Katz, a Princeton University historian,

and begin at 10 a.m.. The speakers of the symposium were chosen because "they have such diverse perspectives and have been engaged in national conversation about liberal arts education," said Deborah Best, dean of the college and organizer of the event.

The second forum, "The Moral Challenges of Professional Life," will be led by *Washington Post* columnist E.J. Dionne and begin at 2 p.m. "This is important to Wake Forest because one of the things that comes into question has to do with how we educate professionals to face the moral challenges they meet on a daily basis," said Bill Gordon, provost of the university, who organized the symposium.

Professors from various universities including Yale University and Columbia University will lecture

at the symposium. "Any one of these people would be marvelous for convocation, but to bring them together and watch the synergy between them will be that much more exciting," Best said.

Both Best and Gordon said that the academic symposia will appeal to faculty, students, staff, members from the Winston-Salem community and even the national academic community.

"Many universities will send delegates from across the country to join in the inauguration events, including these symposia," Gordon said.

Inauguration week begins at 7:30 a.m. Oct. 18 with a private prayer breakfast at Union Baptist Church. A community prayer service will follow featuring Maya Angelou, author and Reynolds Professor of

American Studies, as the keynote speaker.

A student-planned Inaugural Ball will be hosted at the Lawrence Joel Veterans Memorial Coliseum from 9 p.m. to 1 a.m. for faculty, staff, students, alumni, and special guests. The inauguration events will conclude on Oct. 22 with a Stewardship Brunch.

The final President's Weekend Reception will be held in the evening after the football game against North Carolina State University. Special tours, exhibits and open houses will also take place throughout the week.

Hatch, formerly the provost of Notre Dame, took over as president July 1, replacing Thomas K. Hearn, Jr., who served in the university's top office for 22 years.

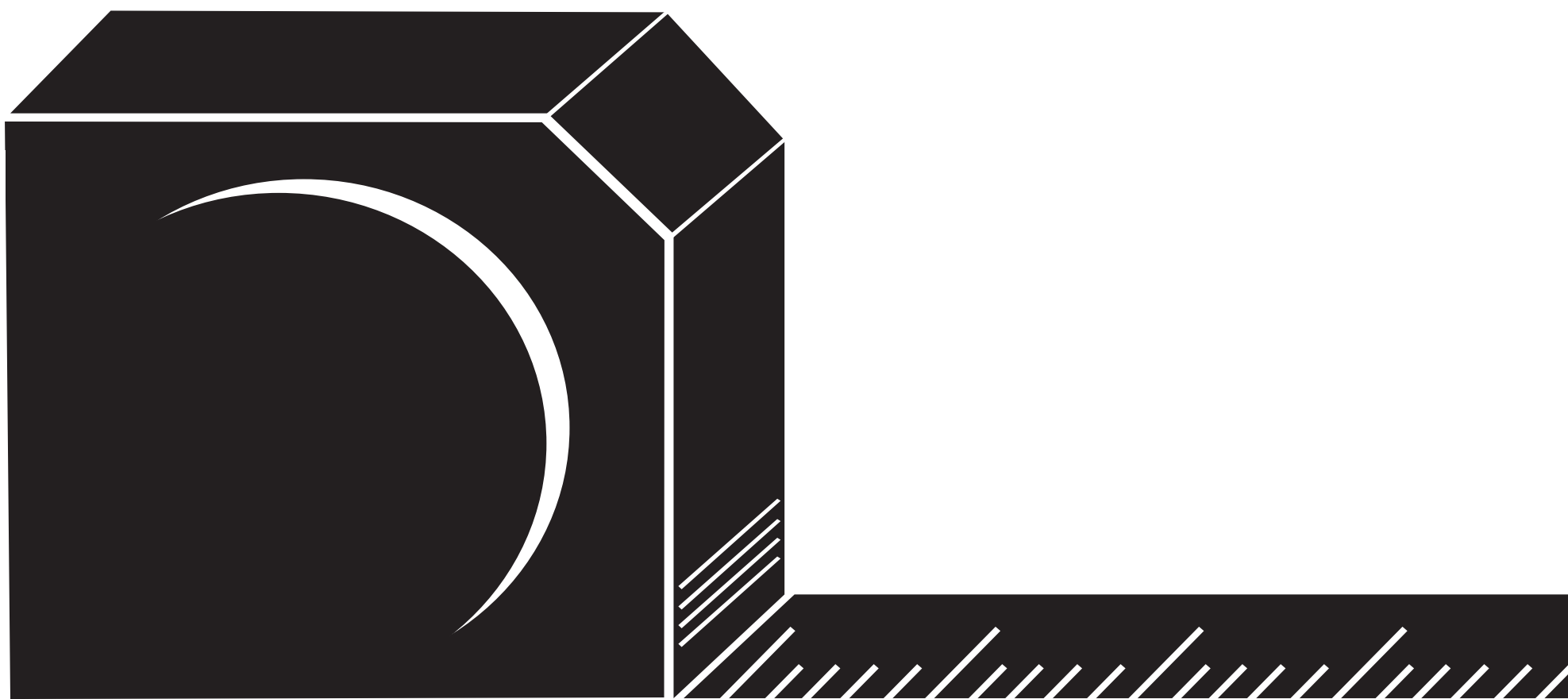
